PLAN FUND ACTIVITIES 2021-22

In principle approval of Rs.70 Crores under Plan Fund Schemes was given to the Institute for Plan Fund period 2012-17, vide letter No. 3(2)/2012-TP dated 06th December, 2013. However, incomplete schemes were rolled over for the subsequent years. Accordingly, Institute continued to receive the balance Grant-in-Aid out of sanctioned Grant of Rs.70 Crores in FY 17-18, 18-19, 19-20, 20-21 and 21-22 for the prescribed schemes.

So far, Institute has actually received Rs. 63.37 Crores out of total sanction of Rs.70 Crores. As on date, Institute has spent Rs.58.81 Crores and returned Rs.0.44 Crores. The balance amount of Rs.4.12 Crores is to be utilized by 31.12.2022.

The detailed summary of the plan fund utilization as on 31.03.2022 is appended below.

FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE

During the FY 2021-22 gross revenue of Rs.31.15 crores was reported as compared to previous year of Rs.27.69 crores, thus increase of 12.50% by Rs.3.46 crores.

The total expenses of the Institute increased to Rs.29.51 crores as compared to previous year Rs.24.57 crores, thus increase by 20.10% by Rs.4.94 crores. This increase is mainly due to the increase in expenses like Property Tax arrears of Rs. 4.12 Crores as well as increase in Salaries & Allowances by 1.29 crores.

Operating income of the Institute has increased by 13.46% to Rs.28.08 crores (FY 21-22) from Rs.24.75 crores (FY 20-21). Operating expenses have increased by 37.08% to Rs.24.51 crores (FY 21-22) from Rs.17.88 crores (FY 2021)

Hence the net surplus (after tax) over expenditure has decreased by 47.44% to Rs.1.64 crores (FY 21-22) from Rs.3.12 crores (FY 20-21)

The Income & Expenditure Statement, the Balance Sheet together with the Schedules are placed. The statutory Auditors report to the Members of the Institute is also placed.

Emphasis of Matter

Provisions and Contingent Liabilities

We draw attention to Note (n) of the Notes to accounts regarding Contingent Liability towards Property tax and M/s. A.K Builders which is under litigation. The provisions and the disclosures with regard to matters under litigations have been made based upon the management estimates.

Fixed Assets

As reported in Note (C) of notes to accounts, Capital work-in-progress, inter alia, includes balances pending capitalization and transfer of assets into capital WIP on provisional basis. The said notes to accounts also states about the pending reconciliation of Lease hold premises as per title deeds with the consolidated cost appearing in books of accounts.

Current Assets and Current Liabilities

We draw attention to Note No. (i) & (j) of Notes to Accounts regarding Debtors and Creditors which states that the respective balance of Debtors & Creditors are subject to ledger Confirmations & consequent reconciliations.

Revenue

We would like to draw the attention to Note (b) of the Notes to accounts which states that the revenue recognition policy of the institute and managements assertion to strengthen the Internal

Control System of the institute.





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Miscellaneous

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Indian Institute of Packaging

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The accounting policy as referred to in Note (I) to the notes to accounts to the financial statements with respect to the liability on account of Retirement and other employee benefits, a defined benefit plan, is recognized on actual basis in respect of premium paid by the Institute instead of recognizing the liability for the same as the present value of the defined benefit obligation at the balance sheet date calculated on the basis of actuarial valuation in accordance with the notified Accounting Standard – 15 on Employee Benefits. The consequential impact of adjustment, if any, owing to this non –compliance on the financial statements is presently not ascertainable.

Other Matters

Branch Visit

We have visited two branch i.e. Delhi and Hyderabad for verification of the books, and for other of the branches audit process was carried out on the basis of such documents, reports and records made available to us in Mumbai, which were relied upon by us as audit evidence for conducting he audit and reporting.

Ve further report that:

Ve have obtained all the information and explanations which to the best of our knowledge and elief were necessary for the purpose of our audit:

- a) In our opinion, proper books of account as required by law have been maintained by the Institute so far as appears from our examination of these books;
- b) The Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Statement dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of account.
- c) The accounts are maintained regularly in accordance with the provisions of the Act and the Societies Registration (Maharashtra) Rules 1971.
- d) The receipts and disbursements are properly and correctly shown in the accounts.
- e) The cash balances and vouchers in the custody of the Assistant Director (Budget & Accounts) of the Society on the day of audit were in agreement with the accounts.
- All books, deeds, accounts, records, other documents required by us were produced before us.
- . g) The Assistant Director (Budget & Accounts) and Deputy Director (Admin & Accounts) furnished necessary information requested by us.
- h) No part of the property or funds of the Society were applied for any object or purpose other than the object or purpose of the Institute.
- As on 31st March 2022, an amount of Rs.52,85,678/- was outstanding from Sundry Debtors for more than one year out of the total debtors of Rs. 77,95,127/-

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- j) All expenses incurred on behalf of the society are being sanctioned from time to time by the Governing Body or any other person or persons authorized to do so under the rules and regulations of the Institute.
- k) Grants and Subsidies from the government are recognized when there is a reasonable assurance that the grant/subsidy will be received and all the conditions laid down are complied.
 - When the Grants or Subsidies relates to expenditure, those grants are recognized as Revenue Grants over the periods necessary to match them on a systematic basis to the costs, which it is intended to compensate.
 - ii. When the Grants are received for acquisition of specific assets under Plan Scheme those Grants have been treated as capital in nature.
 - iii. As per Accounting Standard 12 laid down by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, the accounting for Government Grants, grants received for acquisition of capital assets should be reduced from the cost of capital assets purchased. The same principle has been followed during the year by the Institute.

The GOI introduced Vivad se Vishwas Scheme (VsV Scheme) through the 'The Direct Tax Vivad se Vishwas Act,2020. IIP participated in VsV Scheme (Vivaad se Vishwas) under the Income Tax Act for the Assessment years 12-13, 13-14, 15-16,16-17 and 17-18.

Accordingly, tax due under the scheme was paid before the due date amounting to Rs. 3,07,57,960/- for AY 2015-16 and 2017-18 and the follow-up for refund due is also in process amounting to Rs. 4,17,48,915/- for AY 2012-13, 2013-14 and 2016-17.

During the FY 2021-22, Institute has created a tax provision amounting to Rs. 1,00,370,19/-

m) Internal Financial Control

In our opinion and according to the audit procedures employed by us and information /explanations given to us, the internal control systems with regards to the reconciliation of Fixed Assets with the books / Fixed Asset Register and Reconciliation of revenue with the Internal Software i.e LIMS viz-a-viz the books of accounts, in place is not adequate to substantiate the operating effectiveness of such controls.





(o) Presentation of Income & Expenditure Account and Apportionment of Common Expenses

To give true and fair view of the activities carried out by the Institute, the Income & Expenditure Account has been re-grouped during the year under the Heads Research & Development, Educational Activities and Others.

Expenses pertaining to Rates, Taxes and Cess, Repairs & Maintenance, Administrative Expenses, Insurance and Legal Expenses are apportioned to Research & Development and Educational Activities on the basis of Gross Revenue earned.

SCHEDULE "L" NOTES TO ACCOUNTS 2021-22

Significant Accounting Policies and Notes to Accounts

1. Organization

The Indian Institute of Packaging is a National Institute established in May 1966 by the Indian Packaging and Allied Industry and the Government of India, Ministry of Commerce under the Society's Registration Act, 1860. The Institute's endeavor is to improve the standards of packaging needed for the promotion of exports and help to create infrastructural facilities for overall packaging improvement in India through Research and Development, Problem Solving Consultancy, Testing, Training, Education, Industrial co-ordination, information dissemination and other promotional efforts.

2. Significant Accounting Policies

a) Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are prepared and presented on the basis of generally accepted accounting principles. The accounting policies are consistently applied by the Institute and are consistent with those used in the previous year. Accounts are maintained on accrual basis except grant-in-aid received from the Government of India, Ministry of Commerce & Industry and employee benefits like, Leave Travel Concession etc.

b) Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Institute and the revenue can be reliably measured.

i) Income from Research & Development Activities

Revenue is recognized on accrual basis whenever services rendered to the client and revenue can be reliably measured.

As regards to the recognition of the Income of testing activity, the Institute follows the method of issuing the certificate along with the Invoices (Mumbai – HO & Regional Offices). However, the management has expressed its view to carryout a stringent exercise to integrate the Sales / Revenue reflected in the LIMS System with the Accounting Software (Tally).

Similarly, in respect of research /consultancy income the revenue is recognized on issue of final certificate/ report. In case of any pendency related to such reports, the income recognition is postponed until the completion of service under the said contract/s.

Further, the clients pay advance to the institute for conducting of testing, certification etc., and deduct TDS at the same time. However, the revenue on such advances is recognized only when the certificate is issued i.e. on completion of service. Therefore, there is gap between the TDS as reflected on the TRACES portal viz a viz that in the books of accounts which gets reconciled on issue of sales invoice.

ii) Income from Educational Activities

Revenue from educational activities are recognized on receipt basis.

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iii) Other Income

• Interest Income is accounted on accrual basis.



- Rental Income & Membership Subscription are accounted on receipt basis.
- i) The institute has two types of members' i.e. life members and annual members. The discount is given to life members @ 15% & 10% towards annual membership. Since there is no practice to carryout overall reconciliation and control of Membership process, the management intends to carry out a comprehensive exercise prospectively to identify, reconcile & integrate the number of annual members existing in each year and accordingly such discount is allowed only to annual members existing in each year.

c) Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost, less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses if any. Cost comprises the purchase price and any attributable cost of bringing the asset to its working condition for its intended use except a land at Sanathnagar, Hyderabad with the old structure built upon it allotted by the Government of Andhra Pradesh (now Government of Telangana) free of cost vide letter no. G.O. Ms. No.428 dt. 24/10/2002 and four acres of land on perpetual lease basis for 30 years at Sompura, 1st Stage Industrial Area, Bangalore District allotted by the Government of Karnataka free of cost vide their Letter No. HO/Allot/Secy/20471/13050/2012-13 dated 03.01.2013. The amount of Rs.30,090/- incurred towards Registration charges of the land at Bangalore is accounted under Fixed Assets.

The Institute has maintained the fixed assets register year after year by adding the assets purchased / capitalized in each year.

Also, the Institute has system of verification of the Assets at regular interval. Physical verification of a major portion of fixed assets including capital work in progress was conducted by the Institute itself over the years. In the current year the verification of fixed assets has been conducted as on the balance sheet date.

• Lease Hold Land/Building:

During the year 18-19, Institute had acquired Leasehold Building comprising of ground floor, first floor and second floor of CFC building at Apparel Park SEZ, Ahmedabad by Gujarat Industrial Development Corporation at a Lease rent of Rs.18,63,672 for a period of 30 years. The Lease rent thus paid is being amortized over the lease period of 30 years.

During the year 21-22, Institute had acquired constructed built up space with plinth area measuring 5135.52 Sq. Ft. in the Ground Floor at One Stop Service Centre, Non-Processing Area, APSEZ. Atchutapuram, Visakhapatnam District in Survey No.211 part, Duppituru Village, Atchutapuram (M) on a lease period of 33 years starting from the handing over of the physical possession of the said property from Andhra Pradesh Industrial Infrastructure Corporation Limited, a Government company registered under companies Act, 1956, on FREE of COST basis. This lease agreement was signed on 5th day of October, 2021.

Opening Balances comprising of Leasehold land acquired on perpetual lease is stated at the original value and not amortized on year on year basis in the books of accounts.



Further the Institute is in the process of reconciling cost of the above referred Leasehold land as per title deeds / Lease indentures vis a vis consolidated cost appearing in books of accounts as part of the opening balance.

Capital work in Progress of Rs 4,72,07,046/- represents expenditure under process and not put to use as on the date of balance sheet.

Building at Bangalore – Rs. 69,89,694/- The said expenditure is incurred in the construction of building on land allotted from Karnataka Industrial Area Development Board during the years 2013-14 to 2016-17 towards Site leveling, construction of compound wall, Soil testing, sanction fees paid to Karnataka Industrial Area Development Board and construction of drainage pipe etc. Due to technical difficulties in continuing construction activities on the given site, the institute was looking for other viable options such as a readymade building / working space in lieu of the land allotted by the Karnataka Industrial Area Development Board. Now the said project is being taken up by the Institute and the PMC is also appointed.

During the year 21-22 an amount of Rs.4,01,86,033/- has been spent for construction of the building. By August 2022 the project is expected to be over.

Expenditure on procurement of laboratory equipments to the tune of Rs.31,319/- is under process

d) Depreciation

Depreciation is provided using the Written Down Value Method as prescribed under the provision of Income Tax Act, 1961.

e) Impairment

The carrying amounts of assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date if there is any indication of impairment based on internal/external factors. An impairment loss is recognized wherever the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its recoverable amount after approval of Governing Body of the Institute. The recoverable amount is the greater of the asset's net selling price and value in use.

The Institute has few assets which are not in working condition and does not have any realizable value. The Institute being under supervision of Ministry of Commerce & Industry, the provision of impairment could not be made without prior approval of ministry.

f) Government Grants and Subsidies

Grants and Subsidies from the Government are recognized when there is reasonable assurance that the grant/subsidy will be received and all the conditions laid down will be complied with.

When the Grants or Subsidies relates to an expenditure, those grants are recognized as Revenue Grants over the periods necessary to match them on a systematic basis to the costs, which it is intended to compensate.

When the Grants are received for acquisition of specific assets under Plan Scheme those Grants have been treated as capital in nature.

As per Accounting Standard-12 laid down by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, the accounting for Government Grants, grants received for acquisition of capital assets should be reduced from the cost of capital assets purchased. The same principle has been followed during the year by the Institute.



g) Investments

Major Investments being fixed deposits with various banks and long-term investments of Rs.137.50 lacs are made in tax free bonds of HUDCO, IRFCL, RECL& NTPC carried out at cost.

h) Inventories

Inventories of any sorts are not maintained by the Institute.

i) Trade Receivables

Trade receivables having debit balance of Rs. 77,95,127/- and credit balance of Rs.2,99,56,323/- for which confirmations are not received from the parties and are subject to reconciliation and consequent adjustments on determination / receipt of such confirmation.

j) Trade Payables

Trade payables as per Schedule C para (d) amount to Rs. 5,11,59,930/- which consists of credit balances of Rs.5,29,92,265/- and debit balances of Rs.18,32,335/- for which confirmations are not received from the parties and are subject to reconciliation and consequential adjustments on determination/receipt of such confirmation.

Retention Money as per schedule C para (b) amount to Rs.77,34,658/- for which confirmations are not received from the parties and are subject to reconciliation and consequential adjustments on determination / receipt of such confirmation.

k) Foreign Currency Transactions

Foreign currency transactions are recorded in the reporting currency, by applying the exchange rates between the reporting currency and the foreign currency as on the date of the transaction.

I) Retirement and other employee benefits

Retirement benefit is in the form of Contributory Provident Fund (CPF) & National Pension Scheme (NPS) is defined contribution scheme. The contributions are charged to the Income and Expenditure Account when the contributions to the respective funds are due. There are no other obligations other than the contribution payable to the respective CPF/NPS Trust.

Gratuity is the defined benefit obligations and the liability is provided for on the basis of valuation on projected unit credit method made at the end of each financial year by Life Insurance of India. The Scheme is funded with LIC of India in the form of qualifying insurance policy. Premium for qualifying policy are charged to Income and Expenditure account at the end of each financial year.

Leave encashment liability is provided on the basis of projected unit credit method made at the end of each financial year. The scheme is funded with LIC of India in the form of qualifying insurance policy. Premium for qualifying policy are charged to Income and Expenditure account at the end of each financial year.

m) Provisions:

A provision is recognized when an Institute has a present obligation as a result of past event. It is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions are not discounted to its present value and are determined based on best estimates required to settle the obligation at the balance sheet date. These are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

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n) Contingent Liability:

A contingent liability is recognized when there is:



(a) a possible obligation that arises from past events and the existence of which will be confirmed only by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events not wholly within the control of the enterprise; or

- (b) a present obligation that arises from past events but is not recognized because:
 - (i) it is not probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation; or
 - (ii) a reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation cannot be made.

i. <u>Property Tax on the newly constructed premises:</u>

The Property Tax provision for the newly constructed projects as mentioned above has been accounted in the books of accounts.

ii. M/s A.K. Builders – IIP Delhi – Rs,74,61,465/-

Nature of contingency

The suit filed by A.K. Builders is for the recovery of the amount over and above their actual amount due. IIP has paid the complete outstanding amount as full and final amount due as per their invoices and the available records. The Governing Body had rejected such arbitrary claim of the builder. In pursuant to the same order is received from Delhi International Arbitration Court against which legal opinion was sought and Institute has filed a petition challenging the arbitration award at Patiala House District Court. Hon'ble Judge has stayed the payment of the said amount to the claimant.

Further, Appeal under section 37 of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act has been filed by the Institute in the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi against the order of the Hon'ble District Judge Patiala House Court. The case was listed before the Division Bench of the High Court on 04.02.2022 towards admission of the appeal and stay on the award of Arbitrator and Judgement of District Judge.

After hearing out the arguments presented before the Hon'ble bench, the following were granted to the Institute.

- a. The matter was admitted by the Hon'ble bench
- b. Notice to M/s A K Builders have been issued
- c. Stay on operation of the award of Arbitrator and Judgement of District Judge
- d. The case shall be listed on 22.09.2022

The Court also observed that the stay shall only be allowed subject to deposit of 100% of the awarded amount within one month from the date of order (i.e. 04.02.2022).

The total amount awarded by the Ld. Arbitrator was Rs.5857058+10% p,a, interest from 06.06.2019. Thus, the total amount of Rs.74,61,465/- is deposited in favour of "Registrar General, Delhi High Court"



3. Notes to Accounts 3.1 Income Taxes

The GOI introduced Vivad se Vishwas Scheme (VsV Scheme) through the 'The Direct Tax Vivad se Vishwas Act,2020. IIP participated in VsV Scheme (Vivaad se Vishwas) under the Income Tax Act for the Assessment years 12-13, 13-14, 15-16,16-17 and 17-18.

Accordingly, tax due under the scheme was paid before the due date and the follow-up for refund due is also in process.
